

## PUPIL PREMIUM INFORMATION

The Pupil Premium is funding provided to school which is additional to main school funding. It is allocated according to the number of pupils on-roll who are eligible for free school meals (FSM), a smaller amount allocated according to the number of children of service families, and an allocation for each pupil who has been 'Looked After' (in care) for 6 months or more. In 2012, funding was extended to include pupils who have been eligible for free school meals within the past 6 years.

It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.

Below is a summary of how the pupil premium was used at Highley Community Primary School during 2013/2014

## **Impact of Pupil Premium Spending**

### **1. Raising Standards**

#### **Attainment at the end of KS2 2013 for FSM pupils**

Percentage of children achieving L4+

#### **Progress by the end of KS2 2013 for FSM pupils**

100% of pupils made at least 2 levels progress in Key Stage 2 in all subjects

20% of pupils made better than expected progress in Reading and Writing

60% of pupils made better than expected progress in Maths

### **2. Social and emotional support**

Boxall assessments show an improvement in pupil's social skills

Pupils progress on track following interventions from Family Support Worker (FSW) and working in the Nurture Room.

Improvement in pupil behaviour at lunchtime – gardening workshops.

### **3. Attendance**

The attendance target set for 2013/2014 by EWO was 96.0% School achieved this target.

### **4. Access to the curriculum**

85% of FSM pupils attended an after school club

25% of FSM pupils attended instrumental lessons compared to 85% of non FSM pupils

100% of FSM pupils attended residential visits

100% of FSM pupils attended education visits
