

## Highley Primary School – Sport Premium

Information about the Sport Premium: This year we have received additional funding for sports. Schools must use the funding to make **additional and sustainable** improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. This means that we need to use the Primary PE and Sport Premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that our school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
