The constant rain that we have been experiencing of late paused yesterday, replaced by sunshine and barmy temperatures. One child said to me "doesn't it feels like a summer's day Mr Plim?" and I had to agree, it certainly did. It was lovely to see how many classes took their learning outside yesterday, whether they were finishing their Design & Technology projects, starting a piece of art-work or just enjoying PE. Fingers crossed it is a sign of things to come. Our attendance this week has also been fantastic – over 96% every day and because of this, we had a whole-school extended play-time this morning!

We took a group of 10 netball players to Idsall Secondary School this week. Having not played together before, we were delighted that the team were awarded the 'determination' award for their efforts. Miss Jones, who took them, said that they were an absolute pleasure to take off-site and represented Highley School superbly! Well done all!

We have changed the date of our annual RSE (Relationships and Sex Education) consultation for parents to <u>Wednesday lst May at 2pm</u>. This is an opportunity to drop into school before collecting children, to have a chat with staff, look at the materials/resources we use in all year groups, and ask any questions you may have.

Also on the horizon are Year 6 SATS assessments. As these assessments test children's knowledge of the whole Key Stage 2 curriculum, our Year 6s are currently very focused on preparing for them – covering an incredible number of concepts to make sure they are as prepared as possible! As ever, we will support and help the pupils, to have confidence and just do their best. For our Year 6s, the end of the Key Stage Assessments represents the start of their transition and the many exciting opportunities that go with that, from Crucial Crew to secondary transition, and also enjoying their last weeks at Highley to celebrate their time at the school as well as next steps.

Mrs Butler has asked me to include a reminder about our upcoming 'Aspirations Week' starting Monday 20th May. As part of this, we are still looking for parents/carers who would be willing to talk about their job in a short video, which they need to send into school. The film should be no more than 5 mins or less, and should include content about: (1) what your job is and where you work (2) what sort of things you do in your job (3) what are the best bits about your job and (4) what qualifications/experience do you need for your job. All videos need to be in school by the 10th May so that we can stitch them together!

Attached to the bulletin are notes from this week's Parent Council - we discussed an update on behaviour and rewards, OPAL playtimes and ideas for engaging activities to get parents more involved in school.

Finally, we are aware that there is a plan to close the Shropshire School Library Service from September. We rely on this service heavily for our topic books, artefacts and guided reading books.
