Dear Parents and Carers,

This week I thought it would be good to focus on The Sunshine Room (our Nurture provision).

Whilst many families have benefited from the warm welcome that is found there, I am aware that some of you may be unsure what it is and how it can help the children at our school. The Sunshine Room is run by Mrs Powell and Miss L, so I asked Mrs Powell to explain a little bit about it... The Sunshine Room Nurture Group



We are very fortunate to offer Nurture provision at Highley School. We were the first school in Shropshire to open a Nurture group and have been established for 19 years. The Sunshine Room supports children with social, emotional, behaviour and language difficulties who may find school overwhelming and benefit from small group work.

We have the same daily routine which helps reduce stress and anxiety for children. Our daily routine consists of:

Welcome activity - the children will talk about their feelings.
Sensory circuits - a sequence of physical activities.
Adult led activity – a work-related activity.
Child initiated – children's choosing time.
Snack-time - everyone sits at the table to enjoy a drink and snack.
Storytime

This helps to create an atmosphere where the principles of Nurture can be built upon. These principles are:

> -Understanding transitions -Offering a safe base -Development of wellbeing -All behaviour is communication -Language is vital -Children's learning is understood developmentally.

Whenever I visit The Sunshine Room, I am met with a really lovely welcome and lots of smiling faces. If you think this is something that might benefit your child, please chat to your class teacher (although spaces are strictly limited).
