Dear Parents and Carers.

It's been lovely to welcome lots of children into my office with a conker to enter, next Friday is the deadline, so please use this weekend to have a nature walk and see what you can find! Top 3 will be announced in Friday's assembly, the current one on top of the podium is a stonker of a conker!

The signage for the new 20mph zone is now in place after installation – the yellow zigzags have also had a fresh coat of paint. I know it might be tempting to pull in, park on the lines and drop off, however those lines, which are outside all schools, are there to help keep children safe. They not only mark a safe area for families to cross the road, but they also provide drivers with a clear view of children entering and leaving the school, so they can moderate their driving the closer they come. Blocking this view is dangerous and could cause an accident that none of us would want to witness.

Our Harvest festival assembly will now be next Wednesday 8^{th} October where Reverent Kina will be coming to talk to the children. Please have a root in your kitichen cupboards for any non-perishable items (e.g. tins and packets). Our Year 6s will deliver your kind donations around the village to vulnerable residents. Can I also take this opportunity to remind you that if you are experiencing difficulties and need the support of the Food Bank, please come and talk to us as we have a number of services we can refer to and help.

On the subject of food, our Healthy Eating Week this year is Monday 13th– Friday 17th October – this was a successful week last year where every class made healthy recipes with their work displayed on parents' evening. This year, our focus is healthy lunchboxes, with all classes learning about healthy eating options and designing a healthy lunchbox.

During the week, children can then volunteer to have their lunchbox photographed if they think it is a good example of a healthy lunch, with the best examples displayed alongside the lunchbox designs during parents' evenings later this month. We are hopeful that the School Nursing team will once again come into school to support this with some sessions working with the children. Please remember that snacks for breaktime should either be fruit/vegetables, cheese or yoghurt.

Finally, today was Miss Farley's last ever day working at Highley Community Primary School. After ELEVEN years of loyal services as one of our Play Team and cleaners, Miss Farley is moving onto new adventures. From ensuring lunchtimes are set-up ready for the children and organising the Play Team, to keeping our school sparkling at the end of the day, she has made such a difference to the school and it really won't feel the same without her.
