Dear Parents and Carers,

Safari Park Success & Living Our Values

Our Year 1 and Year 2 pupils had a wonderful time at the safari park yesterday. From wide-eyed amazement as the hippos swung their massive heads together in a disagreement, to thoughtful questions about habitats and a look at the African village to support their topic work, the children were a credit to you all.

Staff were particularly proud of the way they listened carefully, showed patience whilst waiting their turn, and demonstrated excellent manners with park staff and members of the public. They represented our school brilliantly.

Trips like this remind us that education goes far beyond the classroom. The children learn about the world around them - but they also learn from the adults around them. With that in mind, I would like to gently remind families that all communication with school staff, including our front office team, must remain respectful. Aggressive or abusive language, unreasonable demands or persistent pressure do not lead to quicker or better outcomes. Calm, courteous conversations do.

We recognise that, from time to time, there may be frustrations or worries. Please know that we want to help. If you have a concern, speak with us - we are here to support - but we ask that all communication reflects the respectful partnership we are committed to building together.

When children see adults handling challenges through confrontation, they learn to do the same. Calm and constructive dialogue on the other hand, shows children that challenges can be resolved through patience, conversation and collaboration.


## Netherton
