## MESSAGE FROM MR PLIM

Dear Parents and Carers,

It is with a big smile that I write this final bulletin message of the spring term. So much has happened since February half term and our children have enjoyed every minute of it.

Our Science Boffin day on Tuesday began with a special whole-school assembly that simply WOWed. Key

Children explored the properties of different states of matter, and Jane demonstrated different chemical reactions which were very exciting to watch! 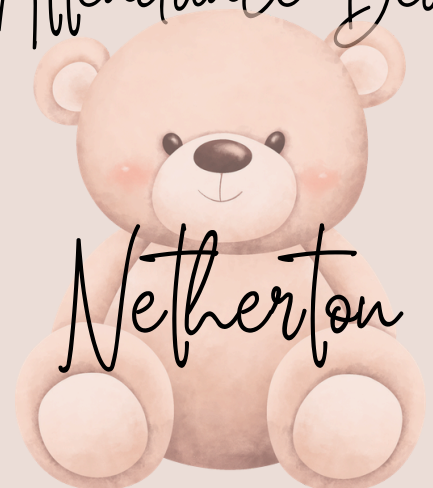
Netherton
