MESSAGE FROM MR PLIM

Dear Parents and Carers,

Netherton

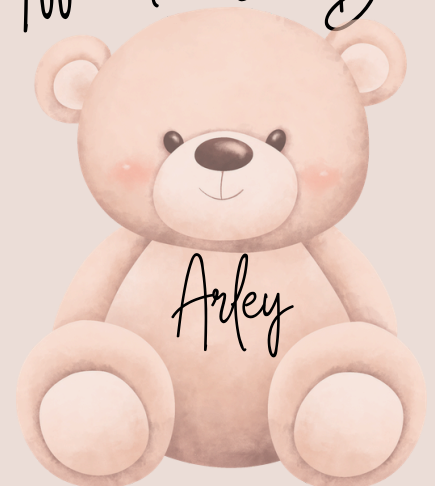
