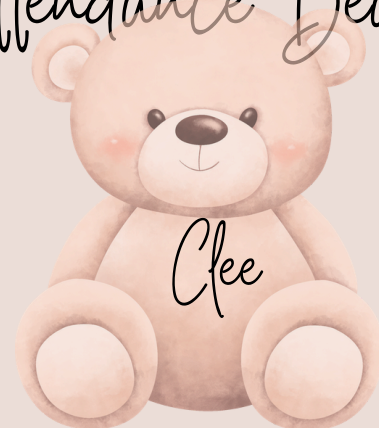
Evaniya is also a little ray of sunshine who brings happiness, positivity, and joy to Miners every day.
