MESSAGE FROM MR PLIM

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we roll into the final two weeks of the school year, I thought it would be useful to list the upcoming activities for Year 6 parents and carers to be aware of:

Thursday 16th July - Y6 Leavers' Lunch (Big Breakfast - their choice! Please book a dinner as normal)

Thursday 16th July - Y6 leavers and annual awards assembly (2pm) - Y6 parents & carers warmly invited to attend

Staff have finished writing children's annual reports, which gives me one week to proofread all 235 of them - one of my favourite parts of the job. They will be sent out to you next Friday (10th July). This year, we will be sending them via email. Attendance information can be found by logging into the Arbor app - please do log in to check this information as we approach the end of the academic year.

For parents and carers in Year 1, the children's Phonics Screening Check results will be sent out at the same time. Likewise, if your child is in Year 4, their Multiplication Tables Check outcomes will accompany their report. For children in Year 6, unfortunately it was announced yesterday by the Education Secretary that KS2 SATs results will not be released until Thursday 16th July, more than a week later than schools would normally receive them. Thankfully, they will arrive in time for us to share the results with children before they finish school the next day.

As we look ahead to the next couple of weeks, we are excited about two fantastic local learning opportunities for our children. On Wednesday, Years 1 and 2 will be taking part in a local history walk around Highley, exploring the village and discovering more about its rich heritage. Reception will be visiting Severn Valley Country Park at some point for a morning of minibeast hunting and outdoor exploration, helping to bring their learning about the natural world to life. This week, our Sunshine Room also enjoyed a wonderful visit to Severn Valley Rescue, where the children met some of the animals in their care and learned more about the important work the charity does to support and rehome them. These experiences are a great way to connect learning with our local community and environment.

As we look ahead and begin planning for the 2026-27 academic year, we would be grateful if you could spare a few minutes to complete [our short parent survey](#). We are proud of the strong relationships we have with our families and value the feedback you provide. Your views help us to reflect on the year, celebrate successes and identify opportunities to make our school even better. Thank you in advance for taking the time to share your thoughts and for your continued support of the school. 😊

Netherton

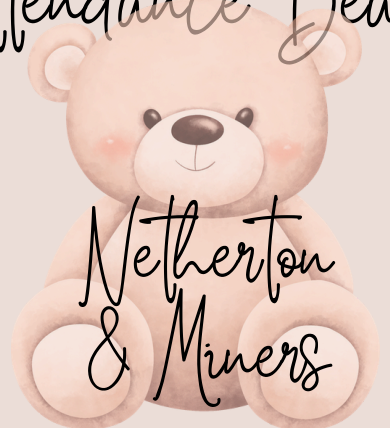
