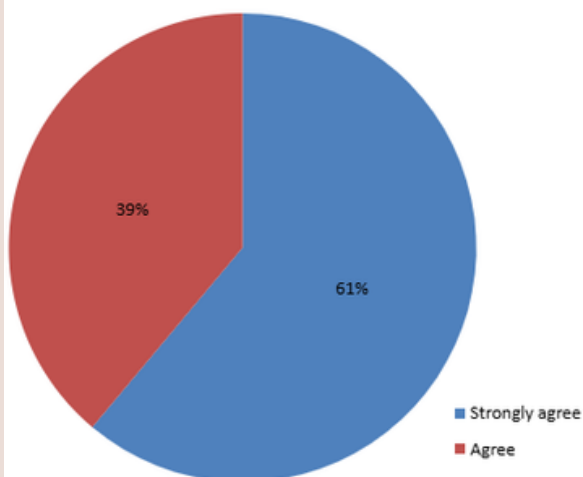


PARENT QUESTIONNAIRE

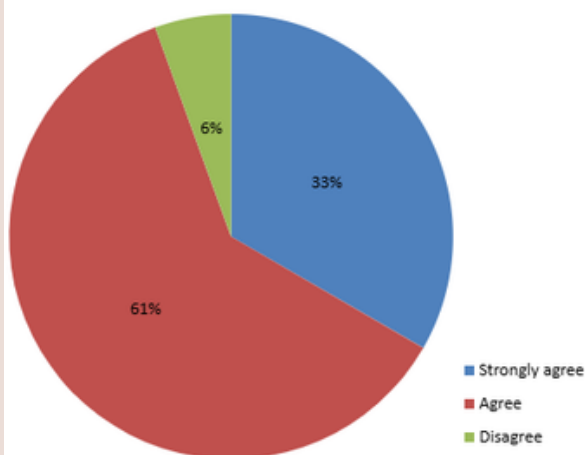

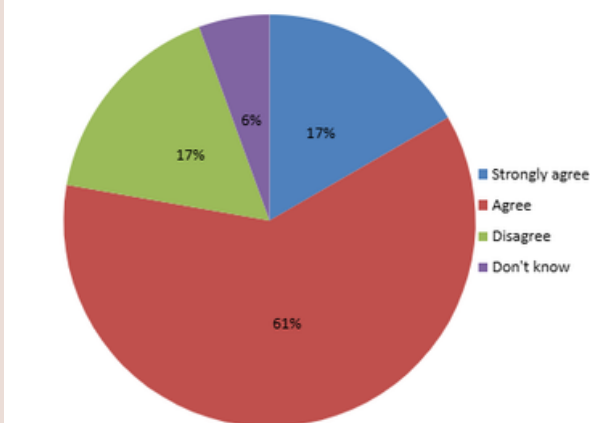

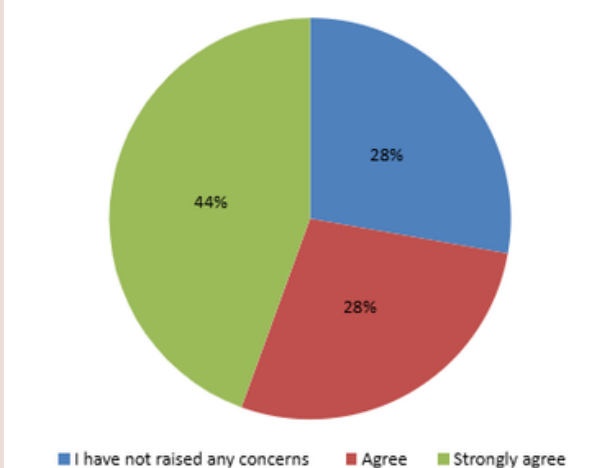
The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.



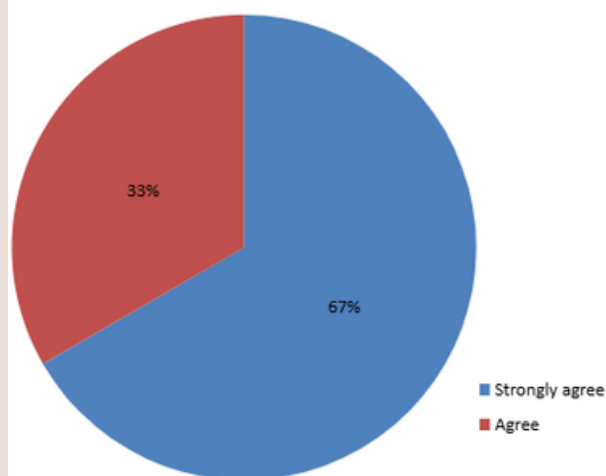
The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.



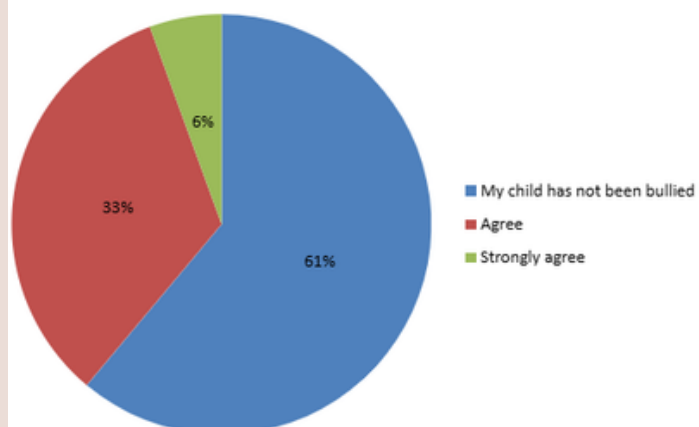
When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly.



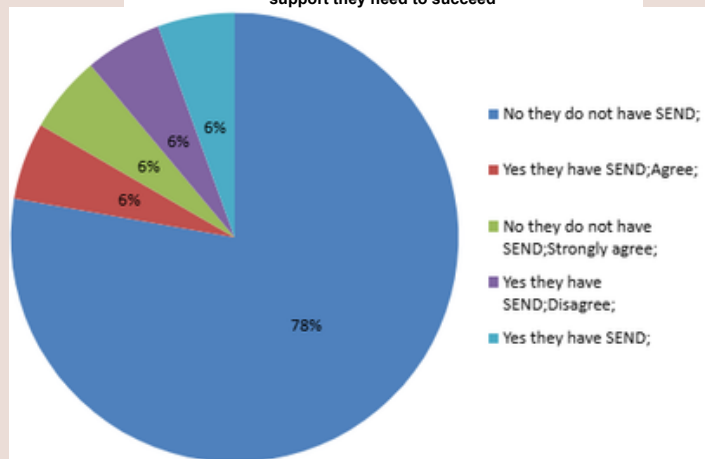
My child feels safe at this school.



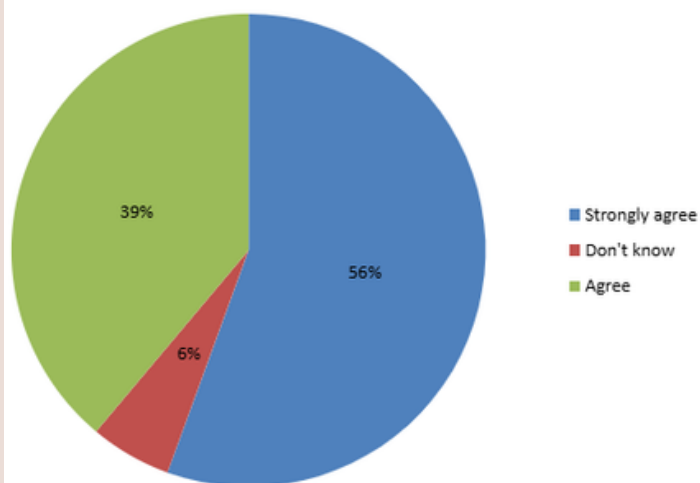
My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.



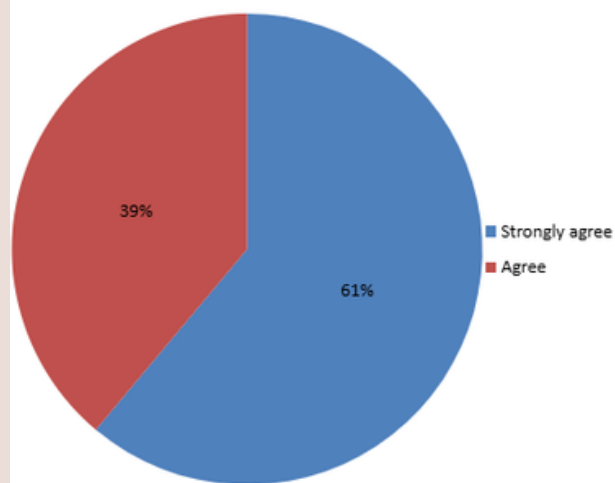

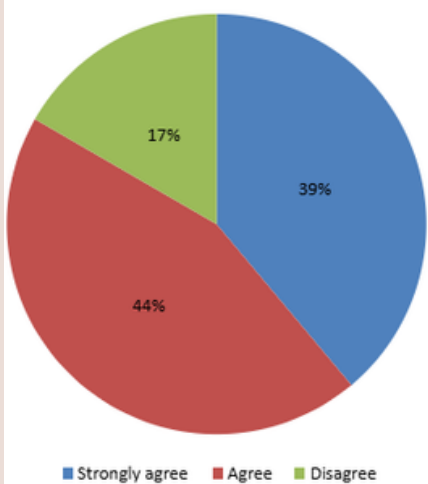
The school has high expectations for my child.



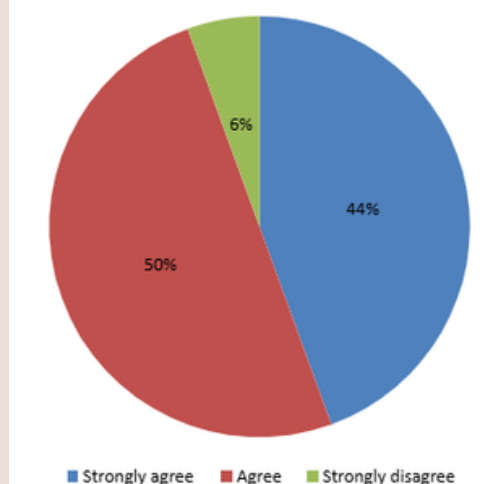

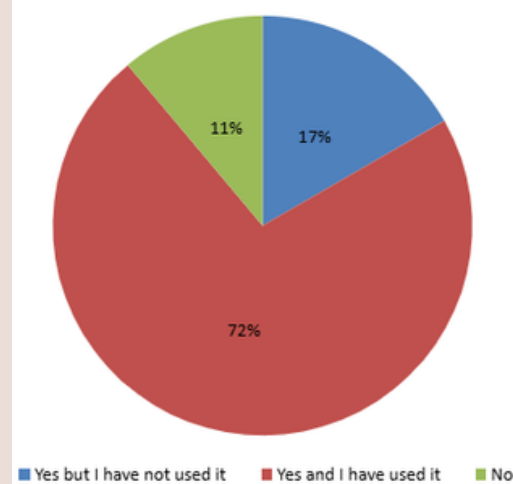

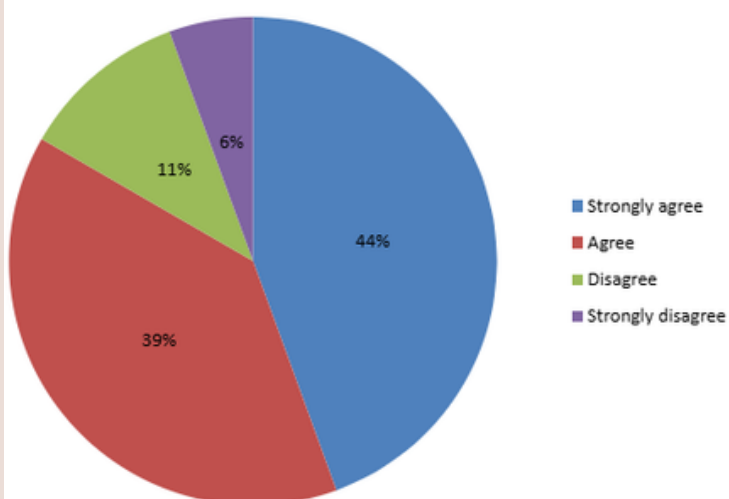

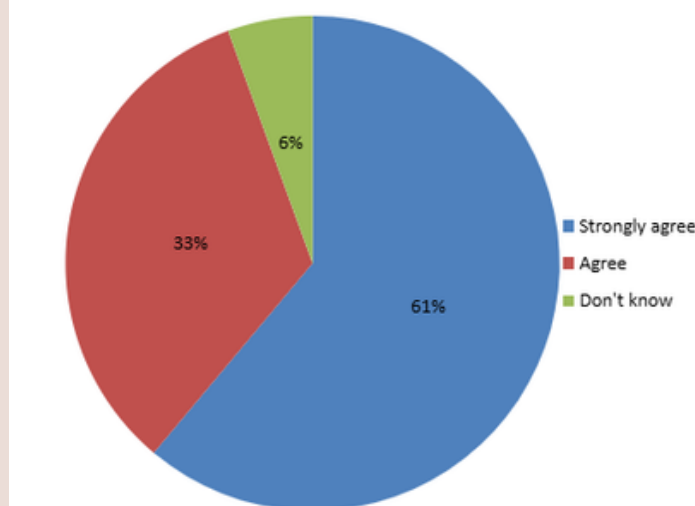
Are you aware of our free breakfast club provision?

In the further comments section, parents shared many positive comments about the school, including: appreciation for the caring and approachable staff, positive feedback about the OPAL play provision and its benefits for children's development, recognition of the positive impact of the free breakfast club, praise for the welcoming school environment and the support provided to pupils and families.

Parents also provided some helpful suggestions for future development, including more frequent updates on children's progress, looking at additional after-school clubs and enrichment opportunities, increased swimming opportunities and improving communication about events and items children need for school. Parents also asked for consideration of the needs of working parents, including wraparound and holiday childcare provision and continued focus on supporting pupils with SEND; ensuring consistency when staff are absent.

Miners

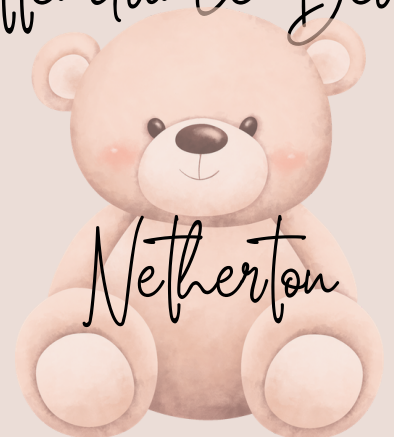
Bernie is the star in Miners this week!
