Elsie was voted for by so many of her classmates, who all see her wonderful qualities. The comment we saw time and time again was simply, "She's really kind."

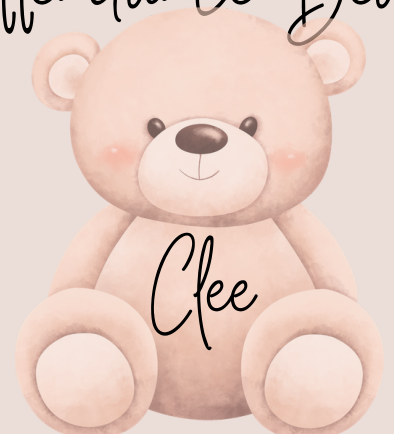
Elsie's kindness and care for others make a difference every day, and we are incredibly proud of her. Congratulations, Elsie!
